



The single greatest cause of malfunctions or problems with a firearm is improper maintenance. All too often, well-designed and well-built firearms are disabled because the user failed to clean and maintain them as required or recommended by the arms manufacturer.



WARNING



Never attempt to disassemble or reassemble a firearm unless you are absolutely certain that it is empty and unloaded. Visually inspect the chamber, the magazine and firing mechanism to be absolutely certain that no ammunition remains in the firearm. Disassembly and reassembly should follow the manufacturer's instructions. If such instructions are not immediately available, contact the manufacturer to see if they are available. If they are not available at all, then you should consult other reference sources such as reference books or persons with sufficient knowledge. If such alternative sources are not available and you have a need to disassemble or reassemble the firearm, you should proceed basing your procedures on common sense and experience with similarly constructed firearms.

With regard to the use of these tools, the advice of Brownells Incorporated is general. If there is any question as to a specific application it would be best to seek out specific advice from other sources and not solely rely on the general advice and warnings given.

HOW TO USE

NOTE: When scrubbing parts with any cleaning brush and solvent, we recommend the use of appropriate eye protection - some solvents will "etch" the surface of prescription eyeglasses.

The Gun/Parts Cleaning Brush is made of a solvent-proof polypropylene that will withstand all commonly used gun solvents and oils. Because of the long handle and flexible bristles, the Brush can be used to scrub out trigger or fire control assemblies, reach inside receivers or actions, or into most any hard-to-get at spot where grime and gunk can collect. Used with a good quality solvent, the flexible bristles on the Gun/Parts Cleaning Brush will break loose virtually any type of gummed-on dirt and grease.

After using the Gun/Parts Cleaning Brush, it should be thoroughly cleaned before it is put away. When properly used and cleaned, the Gun/Parts Cleaning Brush will normally provide long service.
